Code of Conduct and School Rules

(Student Welfare and Management)

Our school benefits from the positive relationship that exists between staff, parents and students. We believe that parents and the school can work effectively together to overcome any problem in student conduct.

The school aims to be a positive, secure and rewarding learning environment for all students.

Our approach to discipline is to develop personal responsibility and selfdiscipline through an awareness of the consequences of unacceptable behaviour and recognition for positive behaviour.

Our Code of Conduct is built around the following student rights and responsibilities.

Students Rights	Students Responsibilities
The right to feel safe at school	To learn and obey all school rules
The right to learn and play without interference from others	To attend school prepared to learn and play without interfering with others
The right to be accepted as an individual and to be treated fairly and with respect	To treat others with fairness and respect
The right to have differences solved without aggression	To resolve differences through discussion and compromise and not through aggression or conflict
The right to expect their property to be safe	To take care of your own property and the property of others

Underpinning the students' rights and responsibilities are five basic whole school rules. These are:

- Move and play safely
- Care for yourself, others and property
- Resolve problems calmly, sensibly and fairly
- Respect others through your speech, manners and actions
- Work to the best of your ability and allow others to do the same

In addition each teacher develops a classroom Management Plan.
